Production Dates - **27th July - 5th August 2017** at Newlands Community Centre.

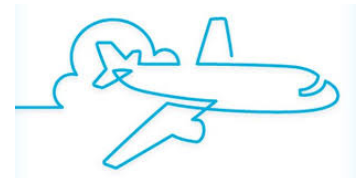
